Building Expansion Vote

Sunday, June 3rd after 9:00 and 10:30 services Thursday evening, June 7th after 6:30 service

After holding four (4) congregational open-forum discussions and receiving very positive overall responses, a congregational vote is being scheduled per our church's Constitution guidelines.

This vote is being conducted to authorize your church Leadership to add approximately 2,400 square feet to our building per the plans, costs and timing criteria presented. A "yes" vote will allow Leadership to determine when to contract and build based on available funds and/or cash flows with reserves to support a partial mortgage.

The vote will be "Yes" or "No" format by standing or showing of hands by qualified voting members.

Member voter qualifications (per Article VIII - Meetings, Section D - Member Voting, Item 2 - Initial Vote):

An active member who attends worship on average twice per month or more for a proceeding 6-month period.

Must not have stated they are attending another church or ceased supporting this church.

18 years of age or greater on the day of the vote.

The votes received from our three services will be tallied and reported within the following week after completion.

On the practical side of things, these growing pains need our consistent attention. May we suggest some polite and considerate actions to make everyone's OCC experience more pleasant...

SO, "PRETTY PLEASE, WITH SUGAR ON TOP..."

- As you find a seat in our sanctuary, move to the middle seats in your section. This will leave aisle seats open to guests/latecomers.
- Leave close-in parking places for our guests and those who may physically need them. Since our parking can be tight, consider ride sharing or consolidating to one vehicle.
- When you "gather in groups" for pre and post service fellowship and conversations, avoid the areas of high traffic flow and congestion. We want you to talk together, just do so in places that make entering and exiting smooth/easy.
- Do your best to habitually arrive on time.
- Plan ahead if you need to request the use of our building since it is busily used all week. All special events should be requested in writing and scheduled through the OCC office. Return any borrowed items promptly and cleanly.
- If you use a church room/space, reset it as you found it and clean up after your event. Remove all trash to the dumpster located in the southwest corner of our parking lot.
- Carefully read church publications and notices.

Thank you for your cooperation in these common sense guidelines and solutions. We praise God for our "growing pains" and ask your help with them.













