Building Expansion Under Way...



The Power of Love*

For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, * neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord.

In Romans 8:38-39 above, Paul lists the things that cannot separate us from the love of God. Of course, the love spoken of here is the mercy that makes us righteous before God's holy justice. Nothing can tear us away from His mercy and bring us back under the condemnation of the Law. So the *love of God* equals our shelter and security in the imputed righteousness we receive from Jesus.

The interesting part of these two verses is the list of adversaries. Paul begins with "neither death nor life" (v. 38). It is unexpected that he would use a negative conjunction to introduce life, but Paul is emphasizing the suffering that believers were facing, dying for their love for Christ. No mater how hard things are, even death cannot separate us from our promised eternal life.

Next come "angels" and "demons" (v.38). Once again angels are not necessarily positive. Angel literally means "messenger" or "intermediary." Genesis 6 is a discussion of angels that have fallen, and in Job we have the adversarial conversation between Satan and God. So Paul could be talking about those who rule on earth and those from the heavens who are standing against God's purposes.

Then Paul inserts the dimension of time: "neither the present nor the future" (v. 38). Neither the confrontations of today nor those that are yet to come—a possible allusion to the end times—present a challenge to God.

Next, the mention of "neither height nor depth" (v. 39) implies once again that no supernatural power from above or below can challenge the power of God. Nothing that God created can separate us from Him. Paul has covered everything, everywhere. Nothing that we have faced or anything that we could possibly face will separate us from God's love and right-eousness.

Have you ever stopped to think about the fact that because of God's love for you, your righteousness can never be taken away? When have you pushed away from God because you didn't feel worthy of His love?
