

Remember¹

I walked into the kitchen, only to find that I had no idea why I was there. How do you remember things? Do you tie string around your finger? Do you use mnemonics, such as HOMES to remember the names of the Great Lakes (Huron, Ontario, Michigan, Erie, and Superior)? Sometimes we set alarms, sometimes we use associations. Concerning the kitchen adventure, I had to retrace my steps to figure out why I had gone there. Whatever the method, the need for reminders make it obvious that the human race is a foraetful race.

God knows this all too well and established feasts to help his people remember important times. The Passover, for example, held on a yearly basis, ensured that the Israelites would always remember their deliverance from slavery, and their protection from the plague that claimed the lives of every Egyptian firstborn. Christians routinely celebrate the memorial instituted by our Lord Jesus Christ, as we remember His sacrifice and offer our thanks.

In secular culture we use holidays to commemorate important dates and events. Ideally, these holidays are more than a day off work or a time for picnics and special sporting events. Ideally, we take some time to remember a person or group of people without whom our lives would be very different.

Such a holiday is Memorial Day. Also known as Decoration Day, many take this opportunity to decorate the burial sites of loved ones who have gone before, and in so doing, cherish the memories that they bequeathed. I have many memories of my own father and mother, aunts and uncles, and half-siblings that greatly impacted my own life. Remembering them is easy. But how do we remember those whom we don't exactly remember? Who are these people?

They are the people who died in military service, who offered the ultimate sacrifice for our nation, who deemed liberty a cause worthy of their very lives. For the most part, we didn't know them nor did they know us. What they knew was that freedom was worth the sacrifice.

What a representation of our own dear Savior Who died to set us

free! Scripture is replete with references concerning freedom. Here are but a few:

"...you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free."

"So if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed."

For the law of the Spirit of life has set you free in Christ Jesus from the law of sin and death.

For freedom Christ has set us free

Now the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom.

Although I can't really say thank you to any of these individuals, perhaps I can simply thank God. Thank You, Lord, for bringing these exceptional people to the perfect time and place, "for such a time as this." Thank You for their courage, for their spirit, for their commitment to the human freedom that You established before the beginning of time. Thank you, Lord, for the hope Your freedom brings to the souls of men.

We also would like to thank each parent for their great support of


