In light of plummeting local infection rates and high immunization rates among our most at risk members, the OCC leadership team announced on Sunday, May 23 that effective Sunday, May 30, 2021, OCC will drop all mandatory mask wearing requirements for all of our programs and services. Those uncomfortable with the risk of not wearing a mask are most certainly welcome to continue wearing one in our services and we ask all of our congregants to be respectful of such decisions, understanding that many who continue to wear masks are not doing so to protect themselves alone, but also to protect at risk patients and family members they serve. We remind any attendees with compromised immune systems that we also offer the services via closed circuit television in our new overflow space, which is less crowded than the sanctuary. On line streaming of our services will also continue throughout 2021.

# Camp OCC Upcoming Changes!

Summer is upon us! County fairs will begin again, fun in the sun all around, and some new changes to Children's Ministry are coming. Due to the drastic change in volunteer numbers and with the goal of bringing back all facets of Children's Ministry, we are rearranging a few classes and age brackets to accommodate. Our current classes are defined as such:

Nursery: 0-24 months (currently closed)

Age 2s and 3s

Age 4s and 5Ks

Age 6K through 5th Grade

With this current model, our nursery has been closed since the first quarantine in March 2020. Effective July 2021, classes will be arranged as such:

Nursery: Age 0 to under 3

Age 3 to 5K

Age 6K to 5th Grade

This means that the only class affected will be the current 2s and 3s class. Two year old children will return to the nursery and three year old children will join the preschool (4s and 5s) class.

This change will allow us to serve families from birth to 5th grade and once again encompass all aspects of Children's Ministry. As with many things in the current climate of change, we will continue to adjust accordingly and when we see a need arise. Thank you for your support of Children's Ministry, encouragement to all the volunteers and staff, and willingness to adjust to minor changes to make this ministry possible.



## OCC's own Ramona "Kathy" Cecil Continues Successful Literary Career as a Christian Writer and Witness

Ramona "Kathy" Cecil is a Christian, wife, mother, grandmother, poet, and award-winning author of historical romance novels for the Christian market. She and her husband of 47 years are the parents and grandparents of two daughters and three grandchildren. They make their home in Seymour, Indiana and they are increasingly active participants at OCC.

A lifelong lover of history, especially Indiana history, she sets the majority of her stories in the Hoosier state. She has been writing creatively since about the age of four when she began composing poetry. Growing up in rural southern Indiana, she found plenty of inspiration for her nature and Christian focused poetry.

Between the mid 1980s and 1990s over eighty of her Christian verses were purchased by a leading publisher of Christian gift items. Since then she has focused on writing historical romance novels and novellas for the Christian market. Her stories are set in the 1800s and early 1900s. Larkspur, her first attempt at writing a historical romance novel, was inspired by the living history museum Connor Prairie in Fishers, Indiana. That book was published in 2006 as a result of winning first place in a contest sponsored by a publishing company. Since then she's had fourteen more traditionally published novels and novellas.

Aspiring writers attending OCC will be excited to learn that we are working on a writer's workshop to be hosted at OCC this coming fall, with Kathy offering her experience and advice to the up and coming writers among us! Stay tuned to the Encourager for more details.
